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OBJECTIVE

This course applies economic principles to understand various aspects of human behavior that have usually been considered to be outside the realm of economics. Topics include irrational behavior, crime, marriage, divorce, family, and philanthropy. Both theoretical and empirical analyses will be emphasized.

- 6. Conduct basic economic analysis and research of the economy and society (Objective 4.4)
- 7. Understand cultural diversity (Objective 6)
- 8. Have informed ethical thinking based on rigorous economic and social analyses (Objective 8)
- 9. Communicate effectively (Objectives 2, 7)
- 10. Be a lifelong user of economic analysis (Objective 9)

TEACHING APPROACH

This course is delivered primarily through lectures and tutorials. Videos (documentary and movie clips) are shown from time to time. Class discussion plays a major role in learning. A considerable amount of time will be devoted to class discussion.

Microeconomics (ECON 3113 or ECON 3014), Econometrics (ECON 3334) Multivariate Calculus

ESSAY

To experience the joy (as well as pain) of scientific inquiry and to train your writing skills, you are required to submit a research essay. The presentation time is about 4 minutes for each student.
